for students, we exceeded the 750 vaccinations that we were slotted for, so we've been working with Maine Health to ensure we have additional slots. Our first one is tonight. I want to thank all the volunteers and Marine Health for bringing the vaccines to our Community. We started the budget process with principals and directors. They will begin working on staffing requests. Hopefully, by the Christmas break, I'll have the first draft of a budget in my hand, and we'll start going over it. It's always interesting because while you have a budget in hand, you don't necessarily know what the state will do, so it's two-sided. When you talk about revenue while we haven't gotten individual districts or municipalities yet they are talking about valuation state-wide at around 5% as a whole. So where we fall above that piece will be a big driving factor for what valuation will look like. We are starting to have some conversations with the Commissioner. Although I think we need to have greater conversations with our state legislators. A reminder that the 90 day grace period for the required vaccination law that was passed is coming near. So any family that still needs to get that information in should. Superintendents and Maine Principals Association are working collaboratively together to try to figure out what indoor athletics will look like this winter and put out a second set of recommendations that hopefully, I'll have for our next meeting.

York County Superintendents Region Winter Sports 2021-22 COVID-19 Guidelines

*The following guidelines have been developed by York County Superintendents as a common framework for the upcoming winter sports season's regular-season play, including all middle school and high school (sub-varsity and varsity level) competitions. These guidelines will be followed by each school **as a minimum baseline** to ensure equity and consistency across the region for athletic competitions with the goal of a successful and fun winter sports season for students and fans. The document is a fluid set of guidelines that will be revisited regularly by the York County Superintendents Association*

Masking

- **Indoor Sports:** Universal masking of all athletes, coaches, referees, and spectators is required for all indoor sports while community spread is at a high (red) or substantial (orange) level as identified by the [US CDC County View](https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#datatracker-home) for our competition area (York, Cumberland, and Oxford Counties). (<https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#datatracker-home>). This includes all middle level, sub-varsity, and varsity level programs. York County Superintendents will meet to revisit guidance as necessary as conditions change.
 - Failure to comply with universal mask-wearing requirements may result in an individual's removal from the venue and a forfeit of the match for the team represented by the individual.
 - While universal mask measures are in place for indoor play, food and drink will be prohibited in the same gymnasium where the athletic competition is taking place. Those schools who wish to set up a separate location for eating and drinking may do so but are encouraged to secure 6-foot distances between individuals. There is no restriction for food and drink for outdoor events.
- **Outdoor Sports:** Universal masking of all athletes, coaches, referees, and spectators is optional for all outdoor sports regardless of the community spread level as identified by the [US CDC County View](https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#datatracker-home) for our competition area (York, Cumberland, and Oxford Counties). York County Superintendents will meet to revisit guidance as necessary as conditions change. (<https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#datatracker-home>). This includes all middle, sub-varsity, and varsity levels.

Fan Attendance (School Facilities)

- Spectators will be required to wear masks during all indoor activities on school grounds.
- Capacity: This will be a local decision based on the school facility and administrative determinations.
- Schools should ensure communications with visiting schools regarding local policies and expectations.
- Spectators at events occurring in off-school-site facilities (leased for rent) will follow guidelines for these facilities (ice arenas, indoor track facilities, etc.).

Vaccination

- COVID-19 vaccination is highly recommended for all athletes and coaches as a measure to reduce serious illness and limit the number of required quarantined individuals on the team as a result of exposure.

Pooled Testing

- Where schools have pooled testing programs available, participation is highly recommended for all athletes and coaches as a measure to identify asymptomatic positive cases, to reduce spread to teammates and other competitors, and to limit the number of required quarantined individuals on the team as a result of exposure.

Tournament Play

- Mitigation efforts during tournament/post-season play will be guided by the Maine Principals' Association and rules established by the host venue.

Outside Facility Use

- Schools will follow guidelines established by off-school-site facilities (leased for rent) like ice arenas or indoor track facilities unless their guidelines are less restrictive than those outlined in this document.

Reminders for Coaches

- Athletes and coaching staff must remain universally masked at all times, including on the bus, during the competition, and in the locker rooms.
- Please remind athletes and coaching staff to step away at least 6-feet from another individual when lowering the mask for a drink of water.
- Remind athletes and coaching staff to regularly wash and sanitize hands, especially when exiting and entering the competition surface.

Other considerations

- Locker Rooms will be accessible to both home and away teams.
- When competing against teams with more stringent guidelines, the more stringent guidelines will be followed.

General Recommendations for Winter Activities

As we head into the 2021-2022 winter season the Maine Principals Association (MPA), the Maine Athletic Administrators Association, the Maine Superintendents' Association, the Maine Music Educators Association, and the Maine Athletic Trainers Association offer the following recommendations for school-based extracurricular activities. All agencies agree that education-based activities, including music and performing arts programs, support students with their social, emotional, physical, and mental health and they play a key role in the community. We will continue to seek the safest ways to make activities available for young people across the state.

The mission of the MPA Sports Medicine Advisory Committee is to provide guidance to the MPA member schools concerning the health and safety of students participating in interscholastic sports and activities. Team sports and other group extracurricular activities can increase the risk of SARS-CoV-2 transmission for students, coaches, referees, and staff, especially during indoor and close contact team sports. We strongly recommend that all schools follow this unified guidance for extracurricular activities.

*Please note this information is frequently changing given the nature of COVID-19. For the most up-to-date information please refer to the Maine CDC Covid website (<https://www.maine.gov/dhhs/coronavirus-resources.shtml>)

Guidance for sports, music, performing arts, & other school-based activities:

- Isolation is **required** for positive COVID cases.
- Anyone within six feet for 15-minutes or more within 24-hours of cumulative exposure, or **any direct physical contact with a COVID-positive individual during the infectious period**, both indoors and outdoors, is considered a close contact and must quarantine for 10 days if not vaccinated or participating in pooled testing.
- It is strongly recommended that school staff, and those students that are eligible, be vaccinated. Vaccination remains the most effective means to control the pandemic.
 - Fully vaccinated individuals can refrain from quarantine if they are symptom free and do not become COVID-positive.
 - Fully vaccinated individuals who are exposed to a positive case should be tested 5-7 days after exposure, even if they are symptom free, and should wear a mask until they receive a negative result.
 - Fully vaccinated individuals are encouraged to participate in pooled testing where that option is available.
 - Unvaccinated close contact(s) should be tested as soon as possible and again 5-7 days after exposure if the first test is negative.
 - Unvaccinated individuals who are close contacts must quarantine for 10-days and may not return earlier even with a negative test.
- It is strongly recommended that schools participate in the pooled testing program that is available through the State of Maine
 - For unvaccinated students participating in co-curricular activities, including music, and performing arts, pooled testing is an important way to ensure that these activities continue even when identified as a close contact.
 - Close contacts of an individual with COVID-19 from school-based activities, who are participating in pooled testing, may continue to participate in class,

school sports, school music, and all school-based activities even though they must quarantine outside of school activities.

If a positive pool is detected, all participants in that pool will be tested individually to identify positive individuals. An individual testing positive for COVID-19 should not participate in pooled testing for 90 days after the positive test.

Unvaccinated close contacts who are not current participants in pooled testing; are required to quarantine from class and all school-based activities for 10 days and may not return earlier even with a negative test.

- Consistent and correct mask use when indoors.

Masks are strongly recommended for all students and staff, whether vaccinated or unvaccinated, in indoor settings.

In general, people do not need to wear a mask when outdoors when not within six feet of other individuals.

Masks are required when on school transportation.

If a school consistently enforces universal mandatory masking for classroom exposures, students identified as close contacts from 3-6 foot exposure may only participate in the regular school day. They may not participate in after school activities, and they must quarantine for 10 days outside of class.

- Other CDC guidance:

If people are feeling sick, they should stay home. All quarantine exceptions are voided if the close contact is symptomatic OR tests positive for COVID-19.

Physical distance to the extent possible.

Provide hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol.

Continue to practice hand washing, respiratory etiquette (coughing and sneezing), proper cleaning and sanitizing.

The MPA, and the MPA Sports Medicine Advisory Committee, make the following recommendations for winter indoor sports:

- Each district should have an Emergency Action Plan in place that includes COVID-19 prevention and management strategies that align with federal, state, and local guidance. Districts may institute more restrictive measures.
- Athletes should continue to provide their own water jugs - limit hydration stations.
- Physical distance during pre-game conferences.
- Limit post-game handshake, high fives, fist bumps before, during, and after the game. Continue with good sportsmanship wave.
- Any return to play plan, after a positive case, should include a gradual and progressive return to physical exertion developed by the student's primary care physician.
- Support staff (officials, trainers, game workers) will be assessed by school health officials individually based on their exposure to a positive case.
- Support the Maine Music Educators with their recommendations for a safe return music.
- Schools utilizing venues outside of their school must follow the restrictions in place by the venue. Outside venues follow local school-based guidelines that are in place when hosting school events.

- The Maine Principals' Association will follow Maine CDC recommendations for MPA sponsored post-season play.

* A close contact is defined as being within six feet for 15-minutes of cumulative time in a 24- hour period or any direct physical contact with a COVID-positive individual.

*Close contacts are identified for both indoor and outdoor activities.

* If symptomatic and testing negative for COVID-19, even if vaccinated, must quarantine for 10 days.

* Regardless of masking and participation in pooled testing, if vaccinated & symptom free, then no need to quarantine.

* If positive within the past 90 days, past the 10-day isolation period, and symptom free, no need to quarantine.

Biddeford School Department Winter Sports Guidelines

The Biddeford School District adheres to the recommendations in the [US CDC Guidance for COVID-19 Prevention in K-12 Schools](#) and the [Maine CDC Standard Operating Procedure](#),

Athletes:

All student athletes participating in a winter sport will be required to be fully vaccinated or a participant in district pooled testing.

QUARANTINE GUIDELINES

If a student athlete tests positive for COVID, they are required to quarantine for 10 days from their test date or onset of symptoms. Please notify the School Nurse or athletic trainer as soon as possible.

If a student athlete is deemed a close contact and not exhibiting symptoms, the current quarantine guidelines are dependent upon exposure (community versus school) as well as multiple exceptions:

- **Student athletes who are fully vaccinated** are exempt from quarantine for any exposure in or out of school which includes all school-related activities.
- **Student athletes who participate in weekly pooled testing** are exempt from quarantine only if classified as a school exposure but must quarantine for exposures outside of school activities. Pooled testing does not cover community exposure; therefore, students must quarantine and follow Maine CDC guidelines.

Masking:

The Biddeford School District is currently following the recommendations of the CDC and requires all participants, coaches, game officials and spectators to wear face coverings while indoors at our facilities. If a Biddeford team travels to a facility that does not require face coverings, our student athletes must still wear face coverings per Biddeford School District requirements.

Spectators:

Biddeford High/Middle School will permit spectators at home events at 50% capacity. Tickets will be sold at the door only and tickets will only be sold for high school contests.

All spectators will be required to follow the guidelines set forth by the school district or facility in which a team participates. Based on local policy and facility limitations, spectator access may be limited or prohibited at some schools/locations. **(Spectator attendance is not a guarantee.)**

Ice Hockey Venue Guidelines

Concessions:

Concessions will not be available to spectators at Biddeford sporting events. Also, food will not be permitted at indoor facilities. Spectators will be permitted to bring drinks to sporting events.

Livestream:

All events at Tiger Gym will be live streamed via the NFHS Network. Biddeford High School will not be live streaming events at the Biddeford Ice Arena or Steve White Gym. Live streaming will not be available for Biddeford Middle School contests.

Below are charts with the total COVID positive cases, close contacts, and pooled testing results- broken down by week and school from the start of the school year. Following the charts are statistics of community versus school exposure, full quarantine versus those who met one of the exceptions and were able to remain in school, and vaccination.

- **74 positive cases**
 - 91% identified as community exposure (67) versus school exposure (7)
- **758 close contacts identified**
 - **92 (13%)** had to be fully quarantined from school due to exposure in the community, at sports, or on the bus (masking only modifies quarantine for a classroom exposure).
 - **599 (87%)** met one of the four exceptions for quarantine and stayed in school (vaccination, natural immunity for 90 days, universal masking, and/or pooled testing). Masking and Pooled Testing participants still need to quarantine while outside of school.
