MINUTES January 22, 2020

Attendance: Marty Grohman Chair, Adam Bellefeuille (Absent), Dan Lamontagne, Richard Potvin, Julian Schlaver, Councilor Clearwater (Absent), Councilor Quattrone, Jeff Demers/Public Works Director.

The minutes for December 11, 2019 were accepted as printed.

- Discussed fee for trash cans and tipping fees
- Talked about using private haulers throughout the city to pick up trash and recycling for buildings that were taken out of the system
- Julian asked how people may be able to buy back into the city's trash and recycling system once taken out, stop taking people out of the system, pick up their trash and recycling – use them for income to help pay for the enforcement (Use a Fee Base Structure)
- Marty then spoke about the need to pull bad recycling people out of the system
- Proposed to have larger trash bins
- Increase PAYT bag fee at directors discretion – Large bags \$3.00
- Start working on 5 unit buildings. Do not remove whole building from program if only one bad tenant is not recycling properly - all have individual recycling cans. Have landlord take out bad tenant(s) out of program only. Vote yes
- Spoke more about recycling education – no more Journal
- Talks about a school rep on this committee
- Discussed composting
